Students should initially list the ingredients of a smores with the utilization of listing the items required, and afterward compose a paragraph clarifying sequentially each step on making the smores. Supplies and items will be given and utilized by instructor to introduce project. Students will be required to score 4/5 on the rubric.</i>
