A Translation of a Book Titled: Dyslexia in the Early Years: a Practical Guide to Teaching and Learning by Dimitra Hartas Najwa Mohammed Abu Al-Rish, 2008 The purpose of this thesis was to translate into Arabic the book titled Dyslexia in the Early Years A Practical Guide to Teaching and Learning by Dimitra Hartas 2006 The thesis also aimed at highlighting the problems encountered in the translation at the word sentence text and style levels The methods and strategies for handling such problems were determined and discussed The book was selected for translation due to the significance of its topic and the lack of Arabic references in this field The difficulties encountered in translating the selected book into Arabic were also identified classified and discussed with illustrative examples Finally solutions showing how these problems were handled were proposed It was found that the major problems encountered at the word level pertain to non equivalence polysemy collocation idioms and phrasal verbs technical terms proper nouns names of programmes reports committees and acronyms At the sentence level difficulties revolved around differences between the two languages in structure concord absence of SL structure in the TL cohesion and coherence in the TL text and the use of punctuation marks Finally at the style level the major difficulties identified were in the areas of nominalization vs verbalization subordination vs coordination and complexity vs simplicity in style Page 6 *Resources in Education* ,1999
